**Pennsylvania Cable Network schedules  
interview with author Bruce Mowday  
on his new book *Jailing The Johnston Gang*  
*PA Books show will air Sunday, June 14, 2009, at 9:00 p.m.***

**UWCHLAN** \_ Pennsylvania Cable Network has scheduled an hour-long interview with Chester County author Bruce E. Mowday on his new book *Jailing The Johnston Gang: Bringing Serial Murderers to Justice*.

PCN President and Chief Executive Officer Brian Lockman conducted the interview last month in the PCN studios in Camp Hill. The interview is part of PCN's PA Books series. Previously Mowday was interviewed for the same show for his book on the Battle of Brandywine, *September 11, 1777: Washington's Defeat at Brandywine Dooms Philadelphia*.

*Jailing The Johnston Gang: Bringing Serial Murderers to Justice* was released in March by Barricade Books, a leading national publisher of true crime books. The first printing of the book sold out and a second printing has been authorized.

The book, authored by award-winning investigative journalist Mowday, tells story of the dedicated law enforcement officials that placed their own lives in danger to incarcerate brothers Bruce, David and Norman Johnston and their band of paid killers, rapists and thieves.

"Readers, especially in the tri-state area, have been extremely receptive to the book," said Mowday. "The story still impacts many families and individuals in Chester County."

Large crowds, including more than 100 people at the Oxford Library and a sold-out room at the Chadds Ford Historical Society, have attended talks on the book by Mowday. "I've been receiving calls to schedule additional talks throughout Pennsylvania, Delaware and Maryland. There is tremendous interest in this story of criminals who terrorized this area for decades. The book has also been selling extremely well on Amazon.com."

Chester County, Pennsylvania, District Attorney Joseph A. Carroll called the leader of the gang, Bruce A. Johnston, Sr., the most notorious criminal in the history of the suburban Philadelphia county. Johnston was convicted of six counts of first-degree murder but Mowday has uncovered information linking Johnston to 10 murders, one of them unsolved, including the ambush slaying of two Kennett Square, Pennsylvania, policemen.
